PLANNING APPLICATIONS

The Parish Council meeting held on 5 May 2021 had the following planning applications to consider

21/00290/FULHH - 4 Hecadeck Lane Nether Broughton - first floor extension and dropped kerb.

They discussed the ground floor extension and have no objection to this but share Highways concerns regarding the dropped curb. The parish council also have concerns regarding the timing of this work in relation to the approved application for 20 houses directly opposite, and would like to see a construction / traffic action plan regarding this work and the impact on Hecadeck Lane during this time.

21/00379/ Yew tree Lodge 11 paradise Lane Old Dalby - single storey extension.

The parish council have no objection to this application and give their support.

21/00398 Church Lane Old Dalby - demolition of existing building construction of new single dwelling

The parish council have no objection to this application and give their support.

21/00279/FULHH The Bungalow Melton Road Nether Broughton – alterations and extensions to existing property.

The parish council have no objection to this application and give their full support.
