The Parish Council met on 27 September and discussed the following planning applications:

21/00856/FUL Grena Haven 22 Church End Nether Broughton – rebuild and changed use to holiday lets.

The parish council had no objections to this application as long as the applications respected the ecology report and neighbours wishes.

This was for all villages including Nether Broughton and Queensway to discuss any concerns parishioners may have. 9 members of the public attended, rural crime, speeding around the villages, antisocial parking in certain areas, heavy goods vehicles on unadopted roads were among the topics discussed. Andrew was very proactive and listened to everyone's views and has promised to do everything within his powers to combat these situations, and has promised to have a high presence in all villages while out on his beat in the coming weeks.
